#### **GSK** launches supply deal with AAH and Unichem

GlaxoSmithKline (GSK) has signed a deal to distribute medicines to UK pharmacies exclusively through wholesalers UniChem and AAH.

The arrangements will commence from November 1 and pharmacy discounts will not be affected, the manufacturer said.

AAH and UniChem currently supply more than 80 per cent of GSK's prescription medicines, and they said customers would see no changes to delivery times or ordering patterns.

But the deal met with dismay from the wider industry. Fin McCaul, pharmacist at Prestwich Pharmacy, Manchester, said as a contractor he was "disappointed in yet another nail in the coffin for local whole-salers". He added: "Given the level of change going on, it's critically important PSNC analyses the impact of all these changes on our work environment."

Sue Sharpe, PSNC chief executive, said the deal would "add to the potential impact of the proposed changes to pricing under the PPRS scheme". She said PSNC would seek changes to reimbursement arrangements "to remove, wherever possible, the risk that pharmacies dispense at a loss".

She added that PSNC was unable to control manufacturers or wholesalers but had made its views known to the industry and government.

Wholesaler Phoenix, excluded from the deal, expressed disappointment, saying it believed GSK had "not fully taken into account the independent community pharmacy sector".

GSK is the sixth manufacturer to change its supply terms since September 2006.

### **Boots opens drive through pharmacy**

Boots has opened its first drivethrough pharmacy in a former McDonalds in Colchester.

The store enables customers to order their prescription at a first window, then collect it minutes later at a second. Staff will also manage repeat prescriptions.

Boots said the store will reduce the time taken to collect prescriptions and cut the need to pay parking fees. Boots healthcare director said: "Boots is leading the way for customers needing a accessible, professional and convenient health service, to keep up with the pace of their busy lives."

The concept of drive-through pharmacies is well established in the US and Boots says it will consider opening more if the Colchester store is successful.

#### **Phoenix targets Northern**

#### Sainsbury's pilot travel health clinics

Travel vaccinations and health advice are being rolled out across 21 Sainsbury's stores in the London area.

The clinics will be held in a private Sainsbury's pharmacy consultation room under the auspices of Advantage Healthcare.

Shoppers will be able to make an appointment to see a registered nurse to discuss their travel health needs. Patients will receive immunisations where required.

The pilot could be rolled out to stores nationwide if successful, Sainsbury's said.

David Gilder, head of professional services at Sainsbury's, said: "Busy people can't always get an appointment with their GP at a time that is convenient...what could be more convenient than doing it while you're shopping?"
